COLLECTION DESCRIPTION

The City Federation of Women's Organizations was born in 1910, when the Ithaca Woman's Club, the Woman's Christian Temperance Union of Ithaca, and the Political Study Club (later, the League of Women Voters of Tompkins County) called a meeting of 15 women representing these and other local clubs. At first the Federation occupied rented or borrowed space but soon began considering whether to adapt or build its own downtown headquarters. In 1920 the Winton-Brooks residence, a handsome 1874 mansard-roofed brick dwelling designed by Ithaca architect William H. Miller, was bought for \$17,000.

The Federation Center was in a prime center-city location, the northwest corner of Cayuga and Seneca Streets, and served women and the community at large in many ways for nearly 40 years, but was finally outgrown. Federation members set about raising enough money (more than \$285,000 by some accounts) to rebuild on the same site. Opening in 1960, the new Women's Community Building, again serving both women and the community, included a large auditorium for meetings and events, an adjacent kitchen, many rooms for small meetings, storage space for clubs, living quarters for single working women, and public restrooms.

Overtaken by social changes and financial problems, the Women's Community Building closed its doors in 2012, to be razed and replaced by the six-story Breckenridge Place Apartments for low and moderate-income tenants. At this writing the City Federation still exists, with its future roles in the community yet to be determined.

Other records of the Federation and the WCB exist in the Cornell University Archives.
