What can a quilt tell us about the history of enslavement, and slave

owners in Tompkins County? Or which locally grown herbs were used in medicinal home remedies? What can quilts tell us about families and community?

Knot Sew Fast pulls from the extensive textile and fabric arts collections held by The History Center to lay out the stories these functional artworks tell about Tompkins County history.


From quilts made from clothing



scraps to quilts entirely of imported silks - the story of fabric, industry, and transportation is tied up in our understanding of how the materials for each quilt made their way to centrally isolated Tompkins County in the 19th and 20th

centuries. <u>Knot Sew Fast</u> showcases nearly half of The History Center's quilt collection, but looks at each hand sewn work through the lens of the women, families, and communities who made them. Drawing a connection between the sewing circles of rural Danby in the 1800's to the modern quilt guilds that meet in Tompkins County today.

Quilts are a unique measure to explore history **as the practice of quilting was a skill developed and practiced equally by historic Ithacan city-dwellers, as well as our rural township communities** of Trumansburg, Groton, Dryden, Lansing, Caroline, Newfield, and Danby. Historically, quilt-makers (mostly women) performed important but undervalued labor, with their lives less likely to be formally documented. Each quilt is a record of hundreds to thousands of hours of hand labor by both our rural and urban Tompkins County ancestors. These makers lives are informally documented in their choice of pattern, fabric, and the stitches that comprise each quilt.

<u>Library</u> collections. <u>Carrie Mannings Diary</u> <u>1869</u> documents a year in the life of a local teenager circa the mid 19th century. Carrie's diary was first printed for the public by the <u>DeWitt</u> <u>Historical Society</u> (now The History Center in Tompkins County) in 1956, and has been reprinted locally a number of times. Her diary from the year includes her reflections as she worked

on her own patchwork quilt, slowly piecing together scraps of her own story. Carrie died in the Town of Ithaca at 18 years old, and her diary is a rare record of a child's memories of life, work, and play in Tompkins County.

Women of Influence: Each Block A Story quilt is on loan from the <u>Seneca</u> <u>Iroquois National Museum</u>. Quilts have long been used in Native communities to honor individuals of distinction. *Women of Influence: Each Block A* <u>Story</u> builds on that tradition, bringing together 41 Haudenosaunee women who stitched thousands of beads in honor of the Native women who provided support, inspiration, and love for each of them. Beaded samples from the 1940, created by Dorothy Blacksnake Jimerson (Seneca), a grandmother of two of the participants, inspired the use of the flat beadwork style used throughout the quilt. Book a private appointment to discover the value of your family quilts!

Appraisals are completed in private with the owner. The quilt is examined, measured, and photographed. Cathy then conducts research to determine the current fair market value for the quilt. Completed written appraisal is sent to the owner within two weeks.

Cathy Rosa Klimaszewski is a professional quilt appraiser, educator, and consultant. She has curated numerous quilt exhibitions shown at the Herbert F. Johnson Museum of Art, Cornell University, including shows that traveled to the Brandywine River Museum, New York State Museum, and Palmer Museum of Art at Penn State University. Klimaszewski also presents quilt lectures and has taught classes related to quilt history, design, and care.



## Archival Textile Collection Spotlight

## Tompkins County Quilters Guild Collection V-64-1-2

The <u>Tompkins County Quilters Guild</u> was established <u>in 1974</u>, at a time when there were no local, state, or national organizations to support quilting. That year <u>Jeanne Greene</u>, a board member of Ithaca's City Federation of Women's Organizations, suggested holding a weekend quilt show to measure local interest, and 500 people came to see quilts on display at the Women's Community Building. Shortly <u>afterwards the Quilters Guild formed</u> and began The History Center Mail - History Happenings | February 2023 - OPENING OF KNOT SEW FAST

planning a major show for August 21-27 in 1976. Their <u>Bicentennial Finger</u> <u>Lakes Quilt Exhibit</u> displayed 600 quilts from 14 area counties, staged many lectures, workshops and demonstrations,



attracted 8,200 visitors from 31 states and 10 foreign countries, and was hailed as the largest such show to date in the nation.


Since that ambitious effort the Guild has focused on smaller scale programming, including <u>educating the public</u> about this traditional and everchanging art form. Some of their efforts have been <u>on behalf of The History</u> <u>Center in exquisite displays</u> over the years.

Members of the Quilters Guild began donating their records to <u>The History</u> <u>Center's archives</u> in 2011 and we are delighted to keep adding to this rich collection. It contains business records, grant and workshop information, newsletters, correspondence, programs and publicity for quilt shows, and much more.


