THE HISTORY CENTER IN TOMPKINS COUNTY RECEIVES \$3000 TECHNOLOGY AND DIGITIZATION GRANT

South Central Regional Library Council (SCRLC) has awarded a \$3000 Technology and Digitization Grant to the History Center in Tompkins County to digitize historical photographs, maps, and Ithaca city directories from the History Center's collection in support of HistoryForge. The [HistoryForge project](#) combines transcribed census data and historical maps to create a new way to explore the history of the city of Ithaca online. The photographs, maps, and directories digitized as part of this grant award will be used to enhance the HistoryForge website. The digitized items will also be made available online in New York Heritage Digital Collections (nyheritage.org). SCRLC's Technology and Digitization Grants are funded as part of the Regional Bibliographic Data Bases and Interlibrary Resources Sharing (RBDB) Program.

The South Central Regional Library Council is one of nine Library Councils comprising the Empire State Library Network (ESLN). As a multi-type library consortium, SCRLC serves 78 members across 10,000 square miles in the counties of Allegany, Broome, Cayuga, Chemung, Chenango, Cortland, Delaware, Otsego, Schuyler, Seneca, Steuben, Tioga, Tompkins, and Yates. SCRLC provides services to 20 academic libraries, 17 hospitals, 6 public libraries, library systems and their members, 6 school library systems and their members, 11 special libraries and 18 affiliate members. SCRLC reaches over 500 libraries in its service area. For more information about SCRLC, visit www.scrlc.org.

Sisters of Change Exhibit Opening had a packed house!

We had over 120 guests come to the Exhibit Opening for **'Dorothy Cotton and Unsung Sheroes for Racial Justice, Human Rights, and the Vote.'** This exhibit will be on display in the Atrium Tower until May and was created in collaboration with the [Dorothy Cotton Institute](#). The exhibit highlights the lives of 25 extraordinary women from civil rights and justice movements throughout the United States in the last 80 years. These women, like Dorothy, are often not household names, and are under-recognized in curriculum's and history books, but their contribution to our society is immeasurable. Thanks to a grant awarded by [Humanities New York](#) we're thrilled to continue this collaboration through monthly programs for the duration of the exhibit honoring the lives of women change makers in our community and the nation. .

Attendants enjoyed wine and appetizers as they explored the new exhibits before moving into the Ithaca College Gallery/CAP Artspace for a sneak peak of the new documentary "[Move When the Spirit Says Move - The Life & Legacy of Dorothy Cotton.](#)" Funds raised during the event will go towards production costs of the film, honoring this civil rights *shero* and her lasting legacy.
